

## Explanatory notes prison health country profiles

- These country profiles include the majority (but not all) of indicators included in the WHO 'Minimum public health dataset for prison health' survey, conducted over the last year. All indicators will be available in the soon-to-be-launched 'Health in Prisons European Database' – HIPED.
- The data in the profile (apart from national population, income group and income inequality which come from Eurostat, World Bank and OECD) are the data you submitted to us through the 'Minimum public health dataset for prison health', or through subsequent communication with the WHO Regional Office for Europe to clarify the data you submitted.
- 'No national data' means that you reported that you have no data available for the given indicator
- 'Missing' means that you have not submitted a response as to whether you have this data or not. In these occasions, please update us on whether the response should be 'No national data'.
- In the profile we only include data that has been reported as national data. In the instances where data has been submitted which refer to a research study or a survey (even if a representative sample), this has been noted as 'No national data'. However, all such data will be available in HIPED.
- Calculations of percentages of subpopulations within the prison population were made by dividing the subpopulation by the total number of prisoners for that year.
- In a few occasions, we have provided calculations for rates of e.g. prisoners per national population or health care staff per prisoner. Please note that due to differences in dates of the data reported, there may be variations as the rates have been calculated based on the data reported in a given year.
