1. Case summary

The patient in question is a Georgian national, 18 year old, suffering from the following health problem:

- Condition after kidney transplant ICD-10:Z94.0 (October 2016)

The patient is in need of aftercare and takes the following medication:

- Tacrolismus
- Mycophenolat-Mofetil
- Prednison
- ASS (Aspirin)
- Omeprazol
