İpek İlkkaracan (ilkkaracan@itu.edu.tr) is Professor of Economics at Istanbul Technical University (ITU), Faculty of Management, a Research Associate at the Levy Economics Institute in New York and an associate editor of the academic journal Feminist Economics. She is based at Sapienza University of Rome in Italy as Visiting Professor in 2018-2020.

Ilkkaracan holds a B.A. in political science from Swarthmore College, Pennsylvania and an M.A. and Ph.D. in economics from the New School for Social Research, New York City. Her research areas include the care economy, work-life balance policies, economics of time use, gender and macroeconomics, macroeconomics of unemployment and wages, labor market inequalities. Her 2010 edited volume on Work and Family Life Reconciliation Policies and Labor Market Inequalities, a cross-country comparative research study of seven OECD countries including Turkey, is the first-ever publication in Turkish on the issue of work-life balance. Her recent research entails policy simulations on the economic impact of investing in the care economy; and also development of a gender-egalitarian sustainable economic model, which she calls the '**Purple Economy**'.

Ilkkaracan is a member of the Advisory Board of International Women's Rights Action Watch (IWRAP) Asia-Pacific based in Malaysia, also a founding member of Women for Women's Human Rights – New Ways, a feminist NGO based in İstanbul; and the Women's Labor and Employment Initiative (KEIG) Platform, a network of 30 women's NGOs in Turkey; Istanbul Technical University's Women's Studies Center, and the Gender, Macroeconomics and International Economics GEM-Europe network.
