Getting to Strasbourg

Your travel (between the address quoted above and the meeting place) and subsistence expenses (€175 per meeting day) will be covered by the Council of Europe on the terms specified in the attached Rules and reimbursed by bank transfer after the meeting. I would draw your attention to the fact that daily allowances are reduced if certain expenses are met by the organisers (for this meeting lunch will be provided on both days).

A prepaid ticket will be arranged for you. If you do not choose to avail yourself of a prepaid ticket, you are kindly requested to arrange your journey in the most economical

manner. We kindly request that you inform the secretariat by the **2st of May** of your preferred travel times and itinerary. Your travel expenses will only be reimbursed, by bank transfer after the meeting, upon presentation of documentary evidence of the sum actually paid (invoice, copy of credit card slip, etc...). If an invoice is provided, this must be the original document issued by the travel agency or airline that issued the ticket. If an electronic ticket is purchased, a confirmation of the online booking giving the total cost of the ticket must be provided, along with proof of payment (invoice, credit card slip, monthly or internet bank statement).

By Air

Strasbourg-Entzheim International Airport is just 10 km from Strasbourg city centre via the motorway.

Train shuttles connect the airport to Strasbourg railway station and run up to 4 times per hour, with a journey time of 9 minutes.

There are regular direct trains from Saint-Louis railway station to Strasbourg. A regular shuttle bus connects the airport to Saint-Louis railway station.

By Train

Strasbourg is connected to Paris by a high-speed train called TGV (train à grande vitesse). Paris-Strasbourg is 1.47 hrs with 16 daily return services.

By Car

From the west (Paris, Benelux) taking the A4 motorway.

From the south (Switzerland, Lyon), taking the A35 motorway.

From the north and east (Germany), taking the A5 motorway.

Visas

Participants requiring a visa to enter France must make their own visa applications. The Council of Europe Protocol department can assist by issuing a "*note verbale*" to support their application. Participants requiring this assistance are requested to contact us as soon as possible.

Getting to the Council of Europe



From Entzheim airport to Strasbourg

Taxis are available at the airport until 11 p.m. (the arrival time of the last flight).

Train shuttles connect the airport to Strasbourg railway station and run up to 4 times per hour, with a journey time of 9 minutes.

From Strasbourg railway station

By Tram

Take Tram C from outside the train station, direction 'Neuhof Rodolphe Reuss' and get off at 'République' from where you can take a Tram E direction 'Robertsau-Boecklin' directly to the 'Human Rights' stop (you are in front of the European Court of Human Rights). Then walk to the Council of Europe entrance (Palais de l'Europe building).

By Bus

There is an extensive bus network, details can be found on <https://www.cts-strasbourg.eu/fr/>.

By taxi

There is a taxi rank at the airport, at the railway station and by the main entrance to the Council of Europe.

By car

From the motorway, take the 'Wacken' exit, then follow the signposts 'Institutions européennes' (European Institutions). Go along Avenue Herrenschmidt, through Place de Bordeaux, along Boulevard Ohmacht and Boulevard Jacques Preiss, and on your left up Allée de la Robertsau to the Council of Europe.

There is an all-day free car park near the Council of Europe but public transport is strongly recommended as the number of places are limited in the vicinity.
