EB146 Agenda Management

This document has been prepared in response to the agreement by EB143 that "the Secretariat should provide in advance of each session a document listing each agenda item, outlining the corresponding action requested of the Board. In consultation with the EB Bureau, the Secretariat should propose how each item will be handled."

With respect to time allotted for statements, the Officers of the Executive Board have proposed the following.

- Regional statements* 5 minutes,
- Executive Board members 2 minutes,
- Member States not represented on the Board 1.5 minutes.
- Observers– 1.5 minutes.
- UN and other intergovernmental organizations—1.5 minutes.
- Non-state actors in official relations with WHO- 1.5 minutes
- Following statements by all participants that are not member of the Executive Board, EB member may be invited to provide and additional comments set at 1.5 minutes.

With respect to items on the EB agenda that were considered previously by the PBAC¹, please note that the Chair intends to ask the PBAC Chair to report on the specific recommendations and guidance proposed by the PBAC. In this way, discussion will focus on the PBAC report (as contained in document EB146/3), rather than having another full discussion of each of the documents, which already benefited from an in-depth discussion last week. The Board will decide whether it concurs with the PBAC's recommendations and proposed guidance. If the EB concurs, then the Secretariat should take that guidance into account in implementing its mandates. Such elements will guide the Secretariat in its work and will be duly reflected in reports to governing bodies under existing mandates.

The agenda items considered by the PBAC will be taken up on Tuesday, along with items 24.1 Membership of the Independent Expert Oversight and Advisory Committee and 24.2 Participation in Programme Budget and Administration Committee.
