

Notes: Intimate partner violence (IPV) estimates are calculated for lifetime and past 12 months physical and/or sexual violence; Sample/denominator was ever-partnered/ever-married women aged 15-49; The 95% credible intervals (95%CrI) for all estimates refer to the 2.5th and 97.5th percentiles of the posterior distributions; Figures presented in table 1 are estimates derived from population-based national and/or subnational prevalence data. Main data sources include (1) specialized national (or subnational) surveys dedicated to measuring violence against women and (2) international household surveys that include a module on experiences of violence by women, such as Demographic and Health Surveys (DHS). Other population-based surveys were included if the data was deemed comparable.
