

TERMS OF REFERENCE

Monitoring progress towards universal health coverage: generating new evidence on financial protection in health systems in Europe

Short description: FP data analysis GEO

Background: The WHO Barcelona Office for Health Systems Strengthening has embarked on a multi-year project to monitor financial protection in health systems across WHO's European Region. The broad aims of the project are to strengthen the evidence base on universal health coverage and to support policy development at national and regional levels. National experts in Georgia are preparing an assessment of financial protection in Georgia using a new approach developed by the WHO Barcelona Office. New household budget survey data for 2018 became available in 2019.

Objective: To analyse microdata from the 2018 household budget survey data for Georgia using do files supplied by WHO and to use the results obtained from this analysis to update the appendix tables for 2016 and 2017.

Deliverables: (1) log file containing the 2018 results; and (2) 2018 results added to the appendix tables for 2016 and 2017.

Skills required: A very good understanding of health financing policy in Georgia; experience of using statistical packages to analyse quantitative data (STATA); and experience of analysing financial protection using household survey data.

Timetable: The duration of the project is from 18 November to 16 December 2019.

Payment: A payment of USD 500 will be made upon submission to and acceptance by WHO of both deliverables and a financial statement.
